EXAMINER'S REPORT – Physical Theatre


The group performance showed evidence of care taken in presenting the physical theatre *performance material*. The cast understood the material being performed. Unfortunately, the actors performed more as individuals rather than **creating a relationship with each other on stage**.

The group was well-rehearsed, however some showed poor concentration skills. The focus was very much on each individual performance and the group did not build a close actor-audience relationship.
